





**TOM BUTT** has served the public for 19 years, and the **quality of life for Richmond residents** has been his top priority:

- ✓ **Safer:** Richmond's homicide rate is the lowest in decades, and other crime rates continue to drop. Tom Butt has supported full funding of police and crime prevention.
- ✓ **Cleaner:** Tom Butt voted to increase code enforcement — cleaning up graffiti, removing trash dumped in streets and enforcing nuisance, weed abatement and waste ordinances.
- ✓ **Healthier:** "Health in all Policies" ties Richmond's health to all City projects and programs.
- ✓ **Quieter:** Tom Butt is credited with Richmond having more Quiet Zones than any city in California.
- ✓ **Greener:** Tom Butt led the successful effort for Richmond to join Marin Clean Energy, which delivers electricity to Richmond twice as green as PG&E, and saved Richmond nearly \$2 million in just the first year.

**TOM BUTT** played a key leadership role in bringing Rosie the Riveter WWII Home Front National Historical Park to Richmond, testifying before Congress, writing City Council policy resolutions and legislation, founding and serving as president of Rosie the River Trust for 11 years, and raising millions of dollars in grants for the Park’s projects and programs.



**TOM BUTT** saved the Ford Motor Assembly Building from destruction by putting it on the National Register of Historic Places in 1984. Now the Craneway Pavilion brings thousands of visitors to Richmond every year, and several hundred jobs have been created.
